There's a battle underway at Hinepango Wetland in Rarangi. Willow, old man's beard and blackberry are the enemy here. The 27 hectare wetland is one of the largest in Marlborough and its unusual landform makes it almost unique in New Zealand. It's also home to several threatened flora and fauna. Now it is being rescued. With a growing interest from the local community, Rarangi residents Letticia Dodson and Nicole Banks have formed the Hinepango Wetland Restoration Group. Plans are being developed for a loop track, boardwalk, and educational displays so that visitors can enjoy the emerging native landscape and returning wildlife.

Kea Survey Tool

If you are heading for the hills, think about contributing a kea survey or two.

This project aims to measure: Spatial patterns in Kea abundance, and changes in Kea abundance over time. Our chosen metric is the chance of a Kea encounter per observer hour.

How can I contribute?

You can survey for kea whenever you visit the back country for one hour or more. All you need to do is set your intention to survey for kea in advance of your trip, and then record your hours, approximate location, what you were doing and whether or not you heard or saw kea, for each hour that you were out and about.
