Thank you for your Official Information Act request to the Department of Conservation, dated 2 May 2018. You requested the full results generated by the Threatened Species Strategy algorithm...in the preparation of the Draft Threatened Species Strategy which was released in May last year.

You asked for this information as a spreadsheet if possible. Given the amount of data and size of the spreadsheet, I am providing this information as an email attachment. Please note that data on species the Department manages has been reviewed since April 2017 as part of our regular quality assurance checks.

You may notice some minor differences to the list published in the draft Threatened Species Strategy. These changes occurred following the running of the algorithm, and after further consideration by species experts. For example, two powelliphanta were swapped for another two powelliphanta of similar threat ranking; the addition of the great white shark and bubblegum coral, which are in a different management group, into the 'notables' list; and the North Island long-tailed bat and South Island long-tailed bat now being officially determined as being a single species.
