Notice of intention to apply for marine reserves on the southeast coast of the South Island

In May 2019, the Ministers of Conservation and Fisheries announced that statutory processes would begin to establish six marine reserves under the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and five Type 2 marine protected areas and a kelp harvesting prohibition area under the Fisheries Act 1996. Together, these would create marine protected areas on the southeastern coast of the South Island similar to network East recommended by the South-East Marine Protection Forum Rōpū Manaaki ki te Iofa. The identification system used by the forum (e.g. B1) alongside the proposed name of each marine reserve is provided below.

Pursuant to section 5 of the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and section 48 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011, the Director-General of Conservation hereby gives notice of his intention to apply for an Order in Council declaring marine reserves in six areas of sea and foreshore in the southeast South Island, with their proposed names, as follows:

- Waiaki Marine Reserve (B1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 2 km south of the Waiaki River mouth and extends south for 14.8 km (8 NM). The site includes the coastal marine area from MHWS and extends offshore 8 km (4.3 NM). Area: 101.3 km².
- Te Umu Koaui Marine Reserve (D1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 100 m north of the mouth of Stony Creek and extends south to a point approximately 400 m south of the mouth of Pleasant River. It includes Bobbys Head and the entirety of Stony Creek and Pleasant River estuaries. The reserve extends from MHWS to a straight line outer boundary that ranges between 10 km and 12 km offshore. Area: 96 km².
- Papanui Marine Reserve (H1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 6 km out from Cape Saunders and extends north approximately 11 km. It then extends to the 12 NM territorial sea limit, incorporating Papanui Canyon. Area: 167 km².
- Orau Marine Reserve (I1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary extends from Harakeke Point on the Otago Peninsula 17.8 km to the outer point of Saint Clair. It includes Lawyers Head, Miori Head, Seal Point and the waters surrounding Gull Rocks from MHWS. The seaward boundary extends from Harakeke Point to approximately 1 km to the south of the breaking reef to the west of Pomahine (White Island). The area does not include Tow Rock. Area: 28.8 km².
- Okaihae Marine Reserve (K1).** The proposed marine reserve encompasses Okaihae/Green Island, extending approximately 1 km to the north, west and east of the island, and 1.3 km to the south. Area: 5 km².
- Hākinikini Marine Reserve (M1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary begins approximately 0.8 km north of the entrance to Akatoro Creek and extends south along the coastline for approximately 6.5 km to the northern point of Watsons Beach. It extends from MHWS to approximately 0.6 m 1.3 km offshore. Area: 5.9 km².

To exercise that right, whānau, hapū or iwi who exercise kaitiaki in a part of the common marine and coastal area covered by the marine reserve proposals must advise the Director-General of Conservation that they are affected and provide their views on those proposals using the website above. Dual golds for Carrington

Canoeing

Fresh from winning her fourth-straight sportswoman of the year award at the Halberg Awards, Lisa Carrington has captured another K1 double at the New Zealand Canoe Sprint Championships.

The 30-year-old triumphed in the K1 500m final on the final day of the championships at Lake Karapiro yesterday to go with her 11th K1 200m title that she won on Friday.

Yesterday's race in near-perfect conditions was far from easy, with Carrington pushing the whole way by fellow New Zealand squad members Caitlin Ryan and Almee Fisher.

Carrington, the world champion in both events, clocked 1:48.23 – a little under two seconds shy of the world-best time – to retain her national crown.

Ryan finished second in 1:50.42, while Almee Fisher was third in 1:52.54.

The other member of last year's World Cup gold medal-winning K4 500m crew, Kayla Imlrie, placed fourth in 1:56.57.

Carrington was competing in her first regatta of the year on the road to the Tokyo Olympics and knew it was always going to be tough against her national crew team-mates.

"It is never easy. The 500m is always a tough race. You have to be OK with the hurt and try to hang in there. It is nice to be able to do what I've done in training."

Ashton Reiser capped a successful national championships by adding the men's K1 500m title to the K1 200m gold medal he banked two days ago.

The North Shore paddler, who underwent double arm surgery only six months ago, finished fifth in the K1 1000m on Saturday, but was more comfortable competing over the shorter distances.

"The 200m, 500m, the shorter, faster distances is what I love," he said.

"I just love paddling a kayak as fast as I can."

After a winless last weekend against Great Britain in Auckland, New Zealand bounced back to notch back-to-back 3-1 victories against the bottom-of-the-table USA.

Meanwhile, the struggling Black Sticks men's team produced a remarkable turnaround in fortunes over the weekend in Christchurch, losing to Spain 4-1 before defeating the same opponents 3-2 a day later.

Yesterday, Kane Russell was the hero, bagging a pair of goals from penalty corners to lead the Black Sticks to their upset win. Steve Edwards completed the scoring for New Zealand.

Sadio Mané produced the sole moment of quality as Liverpool fended off Storn Dennis and Norwich for a 1-0 win that sent them 25 points clear at the top of the English Premier League.

Notice of intention to apply for marine reserves on the southeast coast of the South Island – Recommencement of Public Consultation

Public consultation on proposed marine reserves was initiated on 17 February 2020 and withdrawn on 9 April 2020 due to New Zealand's emergency response to the global COVID-19 pandemic. The Department of Conservation is now recommencing public consultation and invites public feedback on the proposed marine reserves, which are unchanged from those consulted on in February 2020. Full details are provided below.

In May 2019, the Ministers of Conservation and Fisheries announced that statutory processes would begin to establish six marine reserves under the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and five Type 2 marine protected areas and a kelp harvesting prohibition area under the Fisheries Act 1996. Together, these would create marine protected areas on the southeastern coast of the South Island similar to network 1 as recommended by the South-East Marine Protection Forum, Roopu Manaaki ki te Toka. The identification system used by the forum (e.g. B1) alongside the proposed name of each marine reserve is provided below.

Pursuant to section 5 of the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and section 48 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011, the Director-General of Conservation hereby gives notice of his intention to apply for Orders in Council declaring marine reserves in six areas of sea and foreshore in the southeast South Island, with their proposed names, as follows:

- 1. Waitaki Marine Reserve (B1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 2 km south of the Waitaki River mouth and extends south for 14.8 km (8 NM). The site includes the coastal marine area from MHWs and extends offshore 8 km (4.3 NM). Area: 101.3 km².
- 2. ABs to be based in Aussie for Rugby Championship?

Rugby Australia (RA) is still confident of locking in a four-test Bledisloe Cup series later this year against the All Blacks and putting its hand up to host a revised Rugby Championship in Australia with teams coming together in a bubble.

Interim RA chief executive Rob Clarke will continue discussions this week with Fox Sports about tweaking this year's broadcast deal to reflect the content on offer.

While the Australian domestic competition set to begin on July 3 is important, the major money-spinners are the test offerings later in the year on Australian soil, potentially in front of crowds.

As first revealed by the Sydney Morning Herald in April, RA has been in discussions with Sanzaar as well as New Zealand, South Africa and Argentina about hosting the Rugby Championship.

It is unclear exactly how the competition schedule would look but the idea is for all teams to be housed in the one hub and play matches, in front of crowds or not.

The Rugby Championship, which includes two of the three annual Bledisloe Cup fixtures, was initially set to run from August 8 to September 27 before Covid-19 struck.

Australia's domestic competition, yet to be formally approved, is expected to run until September 19, so test matches could feasibly

begin two weeks after that.

Clarke said RA was "open" to playing the Rugby Championship anywhere in Australia.

"Everybody has committed to try and play a full TRC and we're exploring with the Australian government whether that can be hubbed here in Australia and flying in all of the Sanzaar partners," Clarke said.

"[They would be] in a training bubble and then we can quarantine effectively and then play a competition. That's what we're exploring."

"There will be an extended Bledisloe Cup and we're well advanced in discussions with our New Zealand colleagues on that."

The plan is for two Bledisloe Cup matches to be staged in Australia and two in New Zealand.

Wallabies fans may be rolling their eyes though, given Australia would need to win three of the four tests to regain the Bledisloe Cup, which they have not held since 2002.

"It's a great product," Clarke said. "It gains a lot of attention and we feel at least a four-game series is something that could work into the calendar for this year and will work for us and them."

Meanwhile, Australia's November tests in the northern hemisphere look likely to be cancelled given the infection rates in the UK and Italy.

Clarke is confident of signing off a new broadcast agreement with Fox Sports in coming days and says RA's annual report will be published by next week.

All Blacks helped to inspire Klopp

Football

Champion Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp has revealed how the All Blacks inspired him throughout his nearly two-decade career in charge.

Ahead of the newly-crowned Premier League champions' trip to Manchester City today, Klopp spoke of how New Zealand's premier sporting team shaped his coaching right from the start when taking over German club Mainz 05 in 2001.

Klopp said he adopted the All Blacks mantra: "As long as you wear this shirt, less than 100 per cent is not allowed".

He watched a documentary on the All Blacks soon after taking over and was hooked.

"I was completely impressed by these big fellas and how they spoke about [the shirt]."

"At that time, the All Blacks were, 100 per cent, by far the best rugby team in the world and it was a really impressive thing," Klopp told a press conference.

"[They were] all full amateurs, they worked as butchers, as builders and all that stuff, but these pretty impressive guys, they spoke about their past and what it meant to them to play for this team," he said.

"I'm sure I told this [story] already a few times, but in the last two minutes before the team bus arrived at the stadium, we always listen to the haka... it was pretty loud and impressive and it gave us just a little kick."

"They were the All Blacks and Mainz, the main colour is red, so we made ourselves the 'All Reds'."

"Nobody noticed that because we were a small club and a small team but for us it was big."

"That's how it started for that team, I don't how much the influence was of that, but if you asked the players of that time they would say they really liked it and it gave us the chance, from a team nobody is interested in, to become a team that at least we were really interested in. That helped us."

Klopp guided Mainz 05 to successive fourth placings in Germany's second tier, then in his third season in 2003-04 they finished third and earned promotion to the Bundesliga for the first time in the club's history.

After winning back to back titles with Borussia Dortmund, Klopp took the reins at Liverpool in 2015 and won the Champions League in 2019 then, last week, clinched the club's first and long-awaited Premier League title since 1990.

Public consultation on proposed marine reserves was initiated on 17 February 2020 and withdrawn on 9 April 2020 due to New Zealand's emergency response to the global COVID-19 pandemic. The Department of Conservation is now recommencing public consultation and invites public feedback on the proposed marine reserves, which are unchanged from those consulted on in February 2020. Full details are provided below.

In May 2019, the Ministers of Conservation and Fisheries announced that statutory processes would begin to establish six marine reserves under the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and five Type 2 marine protected areas and a kelp harvesting prohibition area under the Fisheries Act 1996. Together, these would create marine protected areas on the southeastern coast of the South Island similar to network 1 as recommended by the South-East Marine Protection Forum Roopu Manaaki ki te Toka. The identification system used by the forum (e.g. B1) alongside the proposed name of each marine reserve is provided below.

Pursuant to section 5 of the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and section 48 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011, the Director-General of Conservation hereby gives notice of his intention to apply for Orders in Council declaring marine reserves in six areas of sea and foreshore in the southeast South Island, with their proposed names, as follows:

- 1. Waitaki Marine Reserve (B1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 2 km south of the Waitaki River mouth and extends south for 14.8 km (8 NM). The site includes the coastal marine area from MHWS and extends offshore 8 km (4.3 NM). Area: 101.3 km².
- 2. Te Umu Koau Marine Reserve (D1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 100 m north of the mouth of Stony Creek and extends south to a point approximately 400 m south of the mouth of Pleasant River. It includes Bobbys Head and the entirety of Stony Creek and Pleasant River estuaries. The reserve extends from MHWS to a straight line outer boundary that ranges between 10 km and 12 km offshore. Area: 96 km².
- 3. Papanui Marine Reserve (H1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 6 km out from Cape Saunders and extends north approximately 11 km. It then extends to the 12 NM territorial sea limit, incorporating Papanui Canyon. Area: 167 km².
- 4. Orau Marine Reserve (I1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary extends from Harakeke Point on the Orato Peninsula 17.8 km to the outer point of Saint Clair. It includes Lawyers Head, Maori Head, Seal Point and the waters surrounding Gull Rocks from MHWS. The seaward boundary extends from Harakeke Point to approximately 1 km to the south of the breaking reef to the west of Poniuaiahe (White Island). The area does not include Tow Rock. Area: 28.8 km².
- 5. Okaihae Marine Reserve (K1).** The proposed marine reserve encompasses Okaihae/Green Island, extending approximately 1 km to the north, west and east of the island, and 1.3 km to the south. Area: 5 km².
- 6. Hakinikini Marine Reserve (M1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary begins approximately 0.8 km north of the entrance to Akatore Creek and extends south along the coastline for approximately 6.5 km to the northern point of Watsons Beach. It extends from MHWS to approximately 0.6 to 1.3 km offshore. Area: 5.9 km².

Notice of intention to apply for marine reserves on the southeast coast of the South Island

In May 2019, the Ministers of Conservation and Fisheries announced that statutory processes would begin to establish six marine reserves under the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and five Type 2 marine protected areas and a kelp harvesting prohibition area under the Fisheries Act 1996. Together, these would create marine protected areas on the southeastern coast of the South Island similar to network 1 as recommended by the South-East Marine Protection Forum Roopu Manakiri te Toka. The identification system used by the forum (e.g. B1) alongside the proposed name of each marine reserve is provided below:

Pursuant to section 5 of the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and section 48 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011, the Director-General of Conservation hereby gives notice of his intention to apply for an Order in Council declaring marine reserves in the areas of sea and foreshore in the southeast South Island, with their proposed names, as follows:

- Waitaki Marine Reserve (B1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 2 km south of the Waitaki River mouth and extends south for 14.8 km (8 NM). The site includes the coastal marine area from MHWS and extends offshore 8 km (4.3 NM). Area: 101.3 km².
- Tu Umu Koa Marine Reserve (D1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 100 m north of the mouth of Stony Creek and extends south to a point approximately 400 m south of the mouth of Pleasant River. It includes Robbys Head and the entirety of Stony Creek and Pleasant River estuaries. The reserve extends from MHWS to a straight line outer boundary that ranges between 10 km and 12 km offshore. Area: 96 km².
- Papanui Marine Reserve (H1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 6 km out from Cape Saunders and extends north approximately 11 km. It then extends to the 12 NM territorial sea limit, incorporating Papanui Canyon. Area: 167 km².
- Orau Marine Reserve (I1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary extends from Harakeke Point on the Orago Peninsula, 17.8 km to the outer point of Saint Clair. It includes Lawyers Head, Miori Head, Seal Point and the waters surrounding Gull Rocks from MHWS. The seaward boundary extends from Harakeke Point to approximately 1 km to the south of the breaking reef to the west of Pounamu (White Island). The area does not include Tow Rock. Area: 28.8 km².
- Okaihau Marine Reserve (K1).** The proposed marine reserve encompasses Okaihau/Green Island, extending approximately 1 km to the north, west and east of the island, and 1.3 km to the south. Area: 5 km².
- Hikinihiki Marine Reserve (M1).** The proposed marine reserve boundary begins approximately 0.8 km north of the entrance to Akatoru Creek and extends south along the coastline for approximately 6.5 km to the northern point of Watsons Beach. It extends from MHWS to approximately 0.6 to 1.3 km offshore. Area: 5.9 km².

A map of the proposed marine reserves, a consultation document with more information about the areas (including a formal application for the marine reserves) and a link to make an objection or submission are all available at this website: <http://surveys.publicinfo.co.nz/s5/sempp-consul>.
Note: Fisheries New Zealand is concurrently running a consultation process on five proposed Type 2 marine protected areas and a kelp harvesting prohibition in the same area (all using the Fisheries Act). The consultation document contains maps and information about these proposed areas.

Any person, whānau, hapū and iwi or organisation who wishes to object to Orders in Council being made that establish the marine reserves, may do so by specifying the grounds of the objection in writing and submitting them to the Director-General of Conservation using the website above. If you are unable to provide an online submission, you can mail it to the address below.

Under the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011, any whānau, hapū or iwi exercising kaitiakianga in a part of the common marine and coastal area affected by the proposed reserves, have a right to participate in the process and provide their views. The Minister of Conservation must have particular regard to the views of affected whānau, hapū and iwi when considering the proposed reserves. To exercise that right, whānau, hapū or iwi who exercise kaitiakianga in a part of the common marine and coastal area covered by the marine reserve proposals must advise the Director-General of Conservation that they are affected and provide their views on those proposals using the website above. If you are unable to provide an online submission, you can mail it to the address below.

All objections, submissions and advice must be provided by 17 April 2020 (being two months from the date of first publication of this notice - 17 February 2020).

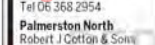

Notice of intention to apply for marine reserves on the southeast coast of the South Island – Recommencement of Public Consultation

Public consultation on proposed marine reserves was initiated on 17 February 2020 and withdrawn on 9 April 2020 due to New Zealand's emergency response to the global COVID-19 pandemic. The Department of Conservation is now recommencing public consultation and invites public feedback on the proposed marine reserves, which are unchanged from those consulted on in February 2020. Notice of intention to apply for marine reserves on the southeast coast of the South Island

In May 2019 the Minister of Conservation and Fisheries announced that summary proposals would begin to establish six marine reserves under the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and five Type 2 marine protected areas and a help/revolving prohibition in the same area (all using the Fisheries Act 1976). Together, these would create marine protection over one of the most diverse and productive areas of the South East Marine Protection Forum (SEMPF) area. This area is currently managed by the South East Marine Protection Forum (SEMPF) in Te Kaha. The identification system used by the forum (i.e. B1) designates the proposed areas of marine reserve as provided below:

Pursuant to section 5 of the Marine Reserves Act 1971 and section 48 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Takaitai Māori) Act 2011, the Director-General of Conservation hereby gives notice of his intention to apply for an Order in Council declaring marine reserves in the area of sea and foreshore in the southeast South Island, with their proposed names as follows:

- Waikaki Marine Reserve (B1)**: The proposed marine reserve boundary extends approximately 2 km north of the Waikaki River mouth and extends south for 14.8 km (19.5M). The area includes the coastal marine area from MHWs and extends offshore to 14.3 NM. Area: 101.3 km².
- Te Kaha Marine Reserve (B1)**: The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 100 m south of the mouth of Stony Creek and extends south to a point approximately 400 m south of the mouth of Stony Creek. It includes Bobby Headland the entirety of Stony Creek and Pigeon River estuaries. The reserve extends from MHWs to a straight-line outer boundary that ranges from 10 km and 12 km offshore. Area: 96 km².
- Papamoa Marine Reserve (B1)**: The proposed marine reserve boundary starts approximately 8 km out from Cape Saunders and extends north approximately 11 km. It then extends to the 12 NM outermost sea limit, incorporating Paparoa Canyon. Area: 167 km².
- Orau Marine Reserve (B1)**: The proposed marine reserve boundary extends from Haukeke Point on the Otago Peninsula 17.8 km to the water point of Sains Cliff. It includes Lawyers Head, Sains Head, Seal Point and the waters surrounding Kall Rocks from MHWs. The seaward boundary extends from Haukeke Point to approximately 1 km to the south of the breaking reef to the west of Pigeon Cove (White Head). The area does not include Teau Bay. Area: 28.4 km².
- Ouhake Marine Reserve (K1)**: The proposed marine reserve encompasses Ouhake/Green Island extending approximately 1 km to the north, east and out to island, and 1.3 km to the south. Area: 5 km².
- Hakiniaki Marine Reserve (N1)**: The proposed marine reserve boundary begins approximately 0.8 km north of the entrance to Alahoe Creek and extends south along the coastline for approximately 6.5 km to the northern point of Watsons Beach. It extends from MHWs to approximately 0.6 to 1.3 km offshore. Area: 53 km².
