## Fabulous facts about... Auckland's shore and sea birds





ou can depend on tarāpunga/redbilled gull to eat your leftover fish and chips.

They are kleptoparasites - animals that steal food from others.

Ithough they look like ordinary sea gulls, tarāpuka/blackbilled gull are found only in New Zealand. More than 90% of their population has been lost since the 1980s.

uturiwhatu/ dotterel build wellcamouflaged nests in the sand above the high tide mark - where their eggs can be easily crushed by people, vehicles, horses, or stock.



rave beyond their small size, highly endangered tara iti/ fairy tern swoop and poop on people getting too close to their young or their nests.





espite living in colonies of thousands, kororā/ little penguin can always find their mates in a crowd, because each one has a unique call.

o catch fish, tākapu/gannets perform a spectacular dive-bomb from as high up as 30 metres. They plunge head-first into the sea at up to 145 km/hr!

ōrea/oystercatchers are great parents and aggressively defend their offspring. They mob aerial predators and lure ground predators, including humans, away with cunning tactics.



ith a wingspan of more than a metre, tāiko/black petrel are well equipped to fly long distances - adults and fledglings migrate to South America every year.
